

November & Demo



On November 18 TAA welcomed Michele Poirier-Mozzone as our guest pastel demonstrator. Michele has a new aquatic themed series. The painting she demonstrated was a replica of one of the series paintings of a girl standing in a pool. Michele had taken a photo of the girl while she (Michele) was submerged. It made for an interesting perspective with a variety of shapes and colors.

Michele used a sanded pastel paper called UART, which has a 400 grit and can withstand an underpainting of watercolor or an oil wash in addition to multiple layers of pastel. Watercolor was used as the underpainting in a contrasting color theme (oranges).

Michele uses a few different brands of pastels, but most especially likes the Terry Ludwig brand. She noted that she doesn't do a lot of blending but when it's needed she just uses her fingers. Layers of color one on top of the other brings the painting to life. The darkest darks are put in first as shapes, no detail. Values are then established. Pastel pencils are used to break the shapes up by adding lines.
