

On Wednesday, April 15th at 7:30 pm, TAA welcomes John Glass as our demonstrator. John started his training in architecture with a degree from Wentworth Institute. He developed his painterly style of art work over a thirty-year period, with instruction under Marshal Joyce, Foster Cadell, and Edward Harrigan.

His subjects, in both oil and watercolor, are rendered with loose and colorful strokes, showing buildings and marsh scenes found throughout the New England countryside. John's paintings are in public and private collections, and his many awards include Best-of-Show at the South Shore Plaza multi art club shows, and the Quincy Marina Bay Annual Arts Affair. His demonstrations include the Randolph Arts-in-the-Park, Easton's NRT fair, and he is a popular guest artist and judge at many art clubs in the Boston area and South Shore.

John has conducted painting classes and on-site workshops. He maintains studios in Randolph and Harwich, has been an active member of a number of art associations, and is now a member of the Guild of Harwich Artists.



On May 30, TAA will be hosting a workshop with Sue Charles, en plein air. with a raindate of June 6.

Sue has a BFA from BU College of Fine Arts and her teachers taught with an old world approach.

Sue's paintings depict light and space with two-dimensional patterns of colors and shapes where thoughts are made visible; Sue finds ways to intersect these ideas.

Sue's smaller paintings are done outside in one session.

Larger paintings are done in the studio with reference materials.

On March 18th, our guest artist of the month was Nancy Sargent Howell. Nancy is a watercolorist who specializes in a "prisming" technique. I'm sure all of you who attended were impressed by this unique technique.

Nancy painted a lighthouse with scrub pines, wild roses and rocks using her prism technique. She had the lighthouse drawn out on an 18X24 140 lb. cold press paper, but aside from that, there was no planning - she let the painting dictate what she needed to do.

She started with the sky which was initially broken up into 3 sections and each section had different colors or values which also had to coordinate with one another. Nancy told us that the blues in the upper sky are always warmer than the blues found near the horizon, which are greener. The color and intesity of the sky dictated where her painting would take her next.

Once the sky was in place, the lighthouse was formed by creating the shadow on the dark side and some "dirty" colors from her palette created the texture of the lighthouse.

While painting the roof and railing black, instead of using

black paint, Nancy created her own black with a mix of raw sienna, red, and ultramarine blue. As she wiped some of the black off the roof on the light side she explained that the lightest darks should always be lighter than the darkest lights. As we scratched our heads and tried to absorb this it was clear what she meant when you looked at the painting.

Next, Nancy let her favorite brush, the fan, "dance" across the paper to create the scrub pines. She then loosely put in some green underneath and scratched with her fingernails to create blades of grass. For the rocks, she brushed on some dark brown, and while wet, ran a razor blade across the paint to create the tops of the rocks, letting the brown show through. With a flat brush she spattered various colors in the foreground for the flowers and tilted the paper up so the colors could run to the bottom.

The last step of the painting was to continue the prisming which she had started in the sky. More prisms were created in the sky and dropped down below the lighthouse.

The whole painting process was very interesting to watch. If you missed the demo you may want to sign up for Nancy's workshop at TAA on April 4. You can visit her website at www.nancyhowellstudio.com.
