On Wednesday, April 21 at 7:30 pm, TAA welcomes Nicole Bergeron as our guest demonstrator.

Nicole, who lives in Falmouth, has always had a passion for art including portraiture and color studies. She studied painting at the Art Institute of Boston and fiber arts at Mass College of Art. Eventually, however, she switched gears and is now teaching special education for autistic children.

Although her career path changed, art is still a vital part of her life and helps her to unwind and focus. At age 10 she and her best friend started painting pysanky eggs for Easter. Every year since, they get together to paint, and now Nicole sells her eggs at craft fairs and online. She loves trying new techniques and pushes herself to grow with her art.

Nicole uses various size eggs from quail to ostrich. She uses wax to "draw" her design then adds layers of paint while removing designated areas of wax before each new color is introduced. She protects the eggs with 10 coats of a glossy polyurethane for a glassy shine and maximum strength.

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On March 17th TAA hosted a demonstration by watercolorist Becky Haletky of Pembroke, MA.

Becky is a self-taught artist whose photography background helps her compose her paintings. For the demonstration she painted cliffs from a photo taken on a trip to Ireland.

Becky painted on Arches 140 lb. rough paper which had been soaked, dried and stretched onto a board. A little masking fluid was applied around the rocks. Always soak your paper, she advised, to get the sizing out. Never paint on your paper the same day you have soaked it; once soaked put the paper on masonite and rub it down with a sponge. Next clip the paper to the board all the way around, blow dry until it flattens, check back and blow dry again then repeat until paper stays flat.

The painting technique Becky used was multiple thin layers of glazing that built up the color. That way the colors shine through one another and create luminosity. One of her most successful paintings, she told us, had at least 50 layers of glazing. She used Utrecht paints which are professional grade paints at affordable prices. The brushes she used are taklon or fake sable and one of her favorite brushes is a Loew-Cornell #12 round.

Becky started painting the sky first (upside down) and it was the only part of the painting where she painted wet on wet. Her favorite sky colors for fog are ultramarine blue and yellow ochre. Working background to foreground she then moved to the cliffs in the distance which were painted with muddy colors. She then worked on the water and rocks before painting in the darks of the cliffs in the foreground, then the brighter greens.

When the painting was finished she removed the masking fluid with a piece of duck tape, which she has found works best for such a task. There was not much masking to remove as Becky is not a big fan of masking fluid. She did mention, though, that your painting has to be bone dry before removing the mask.

Becky's easy-going nature, painting tips and colorful stories made for a fun and informative demonstration. There were a few important tips she left with us:

*Choosing a photo to paint - find what you like about the photo and exaggerate it in your painting. Don't be literal.

*Paint shapes

*Use opposite colors
