Dear Members.

As I close out my time as your president I would like to make a final plea for your help. We hope to set up new committees for the new year to have reliable groups of helpers that will enable our new president and the Board of Directors to plan more events and help with current ones. Some of you have filled out your membership form telling us that you would like to help. We will be calling on you and anyone else who'd like to volunteer. I know there are questions as to what is needed so we've compiled a rudimentary list of duties for the categories we need help with the most.

- ➤ Publicity Post events in the newspapers, make contact with news groups for coverage/photos of upcoming events and possibly someone who can consistently post events on facebook.
- ➤ Art Shows We have a binder with necessary information and forms and the Board members are always available to help. A Chair and Co-Chair is necessary for each show.
- ➤ Grant Writing Someone who can gather necessary information for specific grants, fill out and send in the forms. Right now we apply to a few local cultural councils but we know there are more grants available to us.

- ➤ Workshop Coordinator Right now Sis Denson is our only coordinator. To run more workshops throughout the year we need someone else to coordinate with Sis and obtain and make arrangements with artists.
- ➤ Demo Coordinator One or two people are needed to contact and coordinate artists for the year to do demonstrations. We have 7 demos a year. Artist's artwork picture and bio are needed at least one month prior to the demo to be featured in the newsletter. We like to feature a diverse group of artists throughout the year.
- ➤ Event Planning Person(s) who can plan our events and who have other event ideas that would be beneficial to us and the public.
- ➤ Maintenance We are in need of someone who can keep an eye on the condition of the building and grounds, i.e. change light bulbs, take out the trash, maybe do small repairs, etc.
- ➤ Kitchen/Bath Buy paper and cleaning products as needed, replenish coffee, cream, sugar, etc. You would be reimbursed by TAA for expenses unless they are a donation.



Stone wall: Paint rocks in various colors and add blues for those in the shadows. Spatter, paint in the shadows and blend the edge of the shadows so they are not sharp.



Shingles: Shingles are not painted horizontally. Brush multiple colors over the area randomly. Colors change vertically on weathered shingles. Spattering plain water will create lighter areas. Shadows are applied vertically using a drier brush.

November Demo



On November 20, well-known and popular watercolorist, Andrew Kusmin was our guest demonstrator.

Andrew's demo was very informative and covered a variety of techniques he uses to create his paintings.

In addition to the use of photos, Andrew works parts of his paintings out of his head. He does a lot of boats, florals, cityscapes and some interiors and may spend up to six months working on paintings with a particular subject matter. He plans his paintings ahead of time so he can be more spontaneous when painting and cautions that you don't have to put everything you see in your painting. He mainly paints on illustration board.

Andrew doesn't use frisket for an outline or edge; he'll use masking tape over an object or cut tape for edges with a razor blade. He cautioned not to put frisket on wet paper. He uses a round or flat brush throughout the painting and only uses 9 colors 99% of the time, mixing them and rarely using them right out of the tube. Difficult areas are painted first then layers of glaze are applied, letting each layer dry 24 hours. This allows Andrew to have several paintings going at one time.

For the demo Andrew showed us techniques for sand & rocks, stucco, fall leaves, shingles and stone walls.

Sand: Spatter color while paper is dry and then a few colors at a time while wet. Hold the brush flat to spatter close and hold it horizontally for distant sand and small flat distant rocks. Let dry and spatter again.



Stucco/Adobe: There is some texture and some smooth areas. Start by leaving white shapes, spatter, and brush out some of the spatter to smooth out color here and there. Loosely paint in colors and create texture with your hand.

Fall leaves: Spatter with green then move paint around with the brush. Spatter again with yellows and other fall colors. Let dry a little bit then push the paint around with a razor blade (or any sharp edge) to form the leaves in the foreground. Spatter again and use the razor.
