

Ives Gammel Atelier, where she studied the traditional way to paint in the "Boston Tradition". It was while studying at the Atelier and being surrounded by the galleries of Newbury Street and Boston museums that she discovered the type of artist she wanted to be. Not wanting to paint like anyone else she worked tirelessly to create her own artistic voice from life and not from photographs.

 $\label{eq:constraint} On \ Wednesday, February \ 16, TAA \ welcomed \ pastel \ artist, \\ Michele \ Mozzone, \ as \ our \ guest \ demonstrator.$

Michele, a long time watercolorist, has turned her passion towards pastel. Some of her work incorporates watercolors and pastels. For our demonstration she did a painting of radishes.

Before painting, Michele came prepared with a thumbnail sketch which is vital for values and composition. She works from photos, too, for convenience but added that working from life is good practice. The photos are printed on regular paper instead of photo paper because the poor quality is helpful for value placement. She also made use of her color wheel as a time saver and for accuracy.

Michele used U Art pastel paper, which is like sandpaper; it really grabs the pastels. She used Girault pastels, which, she said, was the best present she ever got from her husband. She also mentioned that she likes Unison and Ludwig.

Michele first did an underpainting with watercolors. Her basic palette consisted of reds, blues and yellows. She varied the colors slightly for each radish and laid in the shadow shapes under the leaves and radishes, then loosely painted in the leaves. After drying she started the pastel process.

Darks and midtones are painted on first, then the lights. She kept a tissue handy to keep the pastels clean. She also had a smaller piece of paper next to the painting to test the colors on before applying to the painting. Bold strokes were used and she said that every stroke should count. If the color is built up too much in an area she suggested brushing the excess away with a stiff-bristle brush.

Michele does not use any fixatives; it changes the color of the pastels.
