On Wednesday, March 20, at 7:00 pm, TAA will welcome George Ferreira as our guest charcoal demonstrator.

George, a resident of Berkley, is a self-taught artist who has been working in the powder mediums of charcoal and graphite since 2004. He constantly experiments with the application of the two mediums and has always been drawn to the look and feel of black & white artwork. He considers his work as paintings since drawing is a small part of the finished work and pencils are used for sharp details.

Since 2005, George has exhibited his work in local juried and non-juried shows and festivals. He has won awards over the years at the Warren Art Festival and the Naragansett Art Show. In January and February of this year George's work was exhibited at the Great Ponds Gallery at the Lakeville Public Library.



TAA kicked off its demos for the year with energetic pastel artist Shelly Eager.

Shelly is an 8th grade Spanish teacher with a passion for teaching, especially when it comes to art. She is a self-taught artist who initially painited with oils. She knew she was on to something when she entered her first oil painting and pastel painting in an art show and won first place for both. Pastels won her over as her medium of choice because the pure pigments of pastels have more luminosity than any other medium. The crystals of the pastel colors reflect the light and do not fade. Pastels are also an immediate medium and one that is great for artists who want to loosen up.

In recent years, as pastels are becoming more and more popular, there are more and more brands of them. Shelly has a collection of different brands as each brand does something different. Some pastels are harder, some softer, and over time you learn which brands work for you.

Shelly's choice of paper is almost exclusively a black sanded paper, which is heavier than other papers. Since most of her paintings are very bright, her creative juices get flowing when she sees her initial bold strokes against the black. She also prefers black because she would rather see black specks of paper showing through her work than white or a lighter color.

For the demo Shelly painted a still life of pears in a silver bowl. She started with hard pastels and put in shapes; she doesn't draw. The

pastel sticks are used on the side when laying down the initial colors. For details, the hard pastels are used on the edge. The darkest darks and lightest lights are laid down in the beginning. She started by blocking in the colors of the main design and didn't work on the background until they were put in. Her colors of choice depend on the value and temperature of adjoining objects. She usually uses every color in the spectrum to make a painting more realistic and all her colors are chosen before she starts.

Once her initial colors were blocked in, Shelly moved to the dry pastels for further color blending. She does not blend colors together with her fingers because the pastels become too muddy. She may lightly go over a color with her finger to smooth, but not blend color into color. If a mistake occurs she will brush off with a foam brush. The final stages of the painting are done with softer pastels. The soft pastels had no sound compared to the hard pastels which can be clearly heard against the tooth of the paper.

For finishing, Shelly just frames behind glass. She does not spray her work because it ruins the pastel crystals and she does not matte her work because the pastel dust that falls on the matte can be distracting and affect potential sales.
