On Wednesday, April 21, TAA hosted a pysanky egg demonstration by Nicole Bergeron.

The word pysanky means to decorate with traditional Ukranian designs. At age 10 Nicole and a friend bought a pysanky egg kit and Nicole was instantly hooked. Now, 16 years later, she's still egging and for the most part is self-taught in the batik-like process of decorating eggs.

To prepare the eggs, Nicole uses an egg drill to make a hole at the bottom then uses a little hand pump to get out the yoke. She then plugs the hole with wax. She told us that traditionally eggs were kept raw and it would take years for the yolk to decompose. But by using raw eggs they become more fragile and by her own experience very smelly when they break, so she always removes the yolk.

To decorate, many layers of beeswax and different colored dyes are applied to create the very intricate patterns. Nicole "dyes" the beeswax by melting black crayons into it so she can see the design easily. The first layer of the design is drawn with the beeswax using an electric stylus with an extra fine tip. It is then dipped into the first color dye for a few minutes. Then the second design layer is drawn with the stylus, then dipped into the next color, and so on until the design is complete and the egg is black. Lighter color dyes are applied first then subsequent darker colors. Her color progression is usually yellow, green, orange, red, dark red, brown, and black. When her design is complete she melts the wax off with the flame from a candle.

It has taken years and lots of practice doing these intricate designs

and figuring which color is under which layer of wax and now she's at the point where she can see the design in her head and do her eggs without pictures for reference.

The sizes of Nicole's eggs range from finch and parakeet (very small) to ostrich. The finch and parakeet eggs are a new acquisition for her and she wants to make earrings and necklaces from them but needs to find the right acrylic resin to fill them with so they won't break. She currently uses quail eggs for necklaces. Pieces of broken eggs are also made into jewelry. Her favorite size egg to use are Bantam chicken eggs (pictured left). She does few ostrich eggs because it takes about 40 hours to complete. There's also a lot of sanding involved in the prep because ostrich eggs are pitted and very shiny. In comparison, quail eggs will only take her 2 hours to complete and that's the size she used for the demonstration.

For the future, Nicole expressed her desire to carve eggs and work with swan eggs, which are a light blue color. She also wants to try non-traditional colors for her pysanky eggs such as blue, purple and pink. She finds "egging" very relaxing and will sometimes work on her eggs for 12 hours at a time.
